



LEARNING OUTCOMES AND PEDAGOGIES

A comprehensive workshop on learning pedagogies and strategies, led by esteemed resource persons Sangita Sinha Roy and Bididha Paul, was organised to equip teachers with effective teaching methodologies and strategies for better classroom management. The workshop began with an interactive session where teachers were encouraged to write about the various problems they face in the classroom. This exercise aimed to surface the practical difficulties educators encounter daily, such as managing diverse student needs, keeping students engaged, handling large class sizes, and addressing behavioural issues. By identifying these challenges, the workshop set the stage for targeted discussions on possible solutions.

Following the identification of problems, a collaborative discussion ensued, allowing participants to share their experiences and brainstorm potential remedies. One of the key activities of the workshop was the designing of plan. Teachers were lesson grouped according to their subjects and schools, promoting collaboration and exchange of ideas. This exercise underscored the significance of structured planning in teaching and introduced participants to innovative approaches to lesson design.

A significant portion of the workshop was dedicated to discussing Bloom's Taxonomy. Sangita Sinha Roy and Bididha Paul explained how this framework can be used to design lessons that promote higher-order thinking skills. They discussed the various levels of cognitive skills outlined in Bloom's Taxonomy—remembering, understanding, applying, analyzing, evaluating, and creating—and provided practical examples of how teachers can integrate these levels into their lesson plans.

The workshop also explored the integration of subjects to create interdisciplinary learning experiences.




