A DEEPER INSIGHT INTO THE WORKSHOPS ORGANISED AT ADAMAS

EXPLORING THE DEPTHS OF OCEAN AND CLIMATE LITERACY

On 28th October, 2024, the students of class 9 of Adamas World School were taken to the university auditorium for a seminar on "Ocean and Climate Literacy Program". Thanks to our respected associate director sir, Dr. Sabyasachi Majumder for giving the students of class 9 such a valuable opportunity of being a part of the seminar.

The convening was being actively hosted by Ms. Debarati Sengupta, the Climate Champion of Young India from West Bengal. It was the first ever state-level youth convening for amplifying conversations on Ocean Governance, and brought together over 120 youth changemakers and more than 10 scientists and experts. The gathering had also invited a GIS expert of the Special Investigation Unit of the Govt. of West Bengal who shared his insights on the importance of water monitoring in Sundarbans Delta region.

The panel discussion played a key role in igniting a wave of hope for the future of Sundarbans. Dr. S.K. Raut played the role of rapporteur for the panel discussion. The experts' knowledge and enthusiasm were contagious! A special chapter on Sundarbans' issues was held at the end of the convocation on 28th October.

The convening improved the understanding of United Nations Decade of Ocean Science for Sustainable Development (2021-2030) and Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). With intergenerational collaboration and knowledge sharing, the convening was instrumental in building ocean-climate literacy among youths and brought together experts to mobilize youth for climate action. Our class 9 students had an enriching experience during the program, thanks to Dr. Sabyasachi Majumder besides the Department of Geography, Adamas University, NYCC and Estuarine and Coastal Studies Foundation (ECSF).



The Mangrove Man

The audience was delighted by the august presence of the 'Mangrove Man of West Bengal' - Mr. Umashankar Mandal.

Mr. Umashankar Mandal is a resident of Charchheri, on Satjelia island in Gosaba. Previously, he was a geography teacher at Jangipur High School in Murshidabad. If there is a person who is wholeheartedly trying to save the fragile endangered Mangroves of Sundarbans, he is Mr. Umashankar Mandal, popularly known as the Mangrove Man. He took an important decision early in life, for he knew how important these mangroves are for Sundarbans and how the entire island area will be wiped off, if they are not saved. He decided to plant 10,000 mangrove trees on July 26, a day declared as the International Day for the Conservation of the Mangrove Ecosystem by UNESCO. He has planted over 6.5 lakhs mangroves within 12 years since 2009. He is also the recipient of the 2021 Tiger Conservation Award.

INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST VIOLENCE AND BULLYING

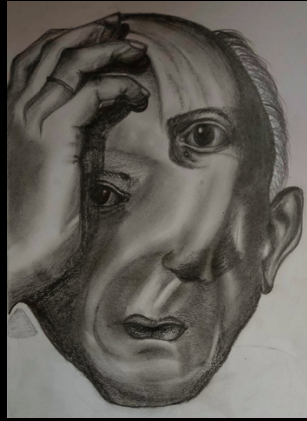

A Single Bullet

June 28, 1914: Seated in a Royal Carriage, a couple passed-
Through the streets of Sarajevo, the heart of Bosnia;
The heir to the throne of Austria-Hungary and his wife,
On their way to inspect the imperial army stationed there;

The Archduke's eyes hardly admired the majesty of the Latin Bridge,
His mind, lost on the the Black Hand's failed assasination attempt on Him,
And the deafening blast of the Bomb still echoing in his ears;
Turning the World around him into a whirlpool of violent emotions.

Perhaps, That's why he failed to see a Youth who was Princip, come out of a Cafe-
Pull out a deadly Semi-automatic from his black jacket,
And shoot One Single Bullet Imprinted with His Majesty's Name;
Which pierced His Neck, with the Finality of Death.

Blood trickled down his war-scarred skin-
The imperial pen filled it's cartridge with that red ink,
Declaring war on Serbia; then, allies stepped in to lend their support; to keep their promises;
And the fate of world history spiralled out of control for the next decade.

20 Years Later, 1917: The Third Battle of Ypres raged at Passchendaele,
The German troops retreated before the Allied onslaught, with heavy losses to their name;
When amidst the battle, A wounded German soldier suddenly-
Walked into the firing range of a British soldier Private Henry Tandey.

He did not fire A Single Bullet; Tandey's conscience overpowered his martial instincts,
And he let the weary man go; Cold-blooded murders were not one of his qualities.
Little did he know that this man would reconstruct Germany; Another 20 Years Later-
From the ashes of the Versailles Treaty, And start another saga of vengeance on His enemies.
